Ponderings from the Parsonage...

Have you ever stopped to consider why Jesus was baptized? Was it significant and necessary? Surely it was not necessary for repentance of *his sins*, which was the baptism of repentance offered by John the Baptist. Even John the Baptist realized this, as he was reluctant to baptize Jesus.

The four gospel writers link Jesus' baptism with the giving of the Holy Spirit. Three of the four gospel accounts also record that this giving of the Spirit is accompanied by a voice from heaven saying that Jesus is God's *beloved* Son and that God is well pleased. Whatever else Jesus' baptism might mean, it definitely is the place where Jesus learns who he is in relation to whose he is. At his baptism, Jesus is given God's gifts of identity and affirmation. And Jesus is labeled as beloved.

In the gospel accounts, the message is clear: the pronouncement of Jesus' identity as *the beloved* precedes his earthly ministry. We might go beyond that and say that by having a clear sense of God's identity as the beloved one and with God's positive affirmation, Jesus can take on that seemingly "mission impossible" in front of him.

This is made clear in Matthew and Luke, where Satan attacks the very core of Jesus' identity: "If you are the Son of God..." Satan introduces doubt into Jesus' relationship with God the Father, because he knows that Jesus, not unlike Adam and Eve before him, is open to temptation. This temptation is linked to how much doubt Jesus might have about his own identity as *the beloved* Son of God and whether or not he trusts in his relationship with God. Does Jesus hold tight to being labeled as the beloved one?

And this is where these stories of Jesus' baptism intersect with the stories of our own. For we too live into the mission that God has set before us to the degree that we hear and believe that we too are the beloved of God. As with Jesus, we discover in baptism who we are by hearing definitively whose we are.

Baptism is nothing less than the promise that we too are God's beloved. No matter where we go, God will be with us and love us. No matter what we may do, God is for us and will not abandon us, but will love us. In baptism we are blessed with the promise of God's Spirit as beloved and marked with the cross of Christ. We are labeled as a beloved child of God forever.

If we are beloved of God, if that is our identity, then our destiny is to be a light to the nations; and we are called to a destiny that is more than just taking up time and space.

We are destined for God's purposes, God's things. "Here is my servant, whom I have chosen, my beloved, with whom my soul is well pleased. I will put my Spirit upon him, and he will proclaim justice." *Matthew 12:18 NRSV*

We are the beloved of God, by virtue of the privilege we share in our baptisms. Like Jesus' baptism, we are marked as beloved of God, with an identity and a destiny beyond all comprehension. Let us never forget who and whose we are. Let us live lives worthy of that destiny to which we are called: beloved sons and daughters of God!

**HIGHLAND PRAIRIE LUTHERAN CHURCH
COUNCIL MEETING
June 8, 2014**

The meeting was **called to order** by council president Gordon Johnson at 9:35 am following the worship service.

Roll Call was taken. All members were present. A **quorum** was called. Pastor Dan and Church Secretary, Lisa Chiglo were also in attendance.

The **agenda** was approved.

The Pastor's Report (copy attached) was reviewed and he encouraged participation in Good Earth Village on the Road taking place at Sylvan Park in Lanesboro June 22-26 and ELCA Day at Valley fair June 30. He is considering an additional year of confirmation focusing on service opportunities for the students.

Correspondence: A thank you letter was received from Faith Lutheran Church for the donation sent to them from our May 11 "noisy offering" to purchase shoes for the students at the orphanage during their upcoming mission trip.

The **Secretary's Report** by Deb was read and approved.

The **Treasurer's Report** was presented by Karen reviewing previous month and year to date income and expenses noting that \$3404 has been raised so far in our envelope special project fund, and the parsonage expenses have exceeded the amount available in the parsonage fund. The report was approved, is available for review and subject to audit.

President's Report

There are problems with some windows in the parsonage. The parsonage sidewalk will be pressure washed.

Committee Reports/Old Business:

Church: Furnace filters have been replaced. Plumbing has been updated. Fire extinguishers have been checked. Shelving has been added in the furnace room and closet. Module for bell in chapel has been repaired. The used lift that we had inquired about was offered to us, but an inspection revealed that the size is obsolete. We will be getting a third estimate for a lift from another company.

Grounds: Indicator on well may be difficult to place due to design. Circuits in shelter have been replaced – there are now nine designated circuits. A tree limb is down near the bowl and will be removed. The materials for the rest house repair are here and the project is expected to begin soon, as well as completion of the pergola project that is being done by the same contractor.

Kaye has received a repair estimate for the log cabin for \$1500. Motion by Sarah, second by Steve to proceed with this project. Motion passed.

Worship: The outdoor worship service on June 22 will be in the band shell. The 160th anniversary planning committee met May 25th and June 1st to continue organizing the event scheduled for August 17th.

Youth and Education: The confirmation program will be reviewed.

New Business

Discussion was held about cleaning of the tables and shelter area prior to a scheduled event and it was decided that it is the responsibility of those using the shelter to clean just before it is used. This will be noted when the space is reserved and we will also enforce the policy that the reservation fee is required to be paid to hold the date for use of the shelter area.

A vintage baseball game at the ball field will take place on August 17th as part of our 160th anniversary celebration. Al Skalet is organizing a team of members from Elstad- Highland Prairie Parish and they will play the Lanesboro Excelsiors using rules for the game adopted in 1860. We will also need a name for our team.

Liability insurance for the South Fork Cemetery can be added as a rider to the church policy for \$17.00/year. Motion by Deb, second by David to purchase the insurance as quoted. Motion passed.

The rest house is not handicapped accessible for wheelchairs – discussed having a ramp made to be available as needed, and to add grab bars in the rest room.

Motion to accept the window project bid was made by Deb, seconded by Steve. Motion passed.

Propane summer fill price will be checked to determine if it is more cost effective to have both tanks filled now.

Several members are forming a historian group with plans to meet monthly. Access to records may require some rearranging of office space to accommodate them.

Motion by Sarah, second by Deb to pay 75% of the fee for our youth to attend the June 22-26 Good Earth Village vacation Bible school in Lanesboro. Motion passed.

The rock garden and flower beds by the parsonage need attention. We will ask for volunteers to help with this project on Wednesday evening, June 11th.

Volunteers will be sought to help Lisa prepare bulletins for worship services.

No further business. Meeting was **adjourned** at 11:06 am

Plan to take vacation during the month of July. Supply preacher is scheduled for July 20th, Pastor Corrine Denis, campus pastor at Winona State. Still need coverage for the other Sundays in July.

I will lead the Bible study during June at Good Shepherd.

I will write the devotional column for the Tri-County Record in mid June.

Hope to have a church float in the Rushford Days Parade (if they have the parade.)

Think about having a service on Memorial Day from now on. We had a 21 gun salute and taps happen at the Highland Prairie Cemetery at 7:45 am with nobody here to witness it.

People have expressed the desire to have regular worship outside including for bowl services instead of special entertainment. Might consider places besides the bowl for worship (band stand, west picnic shelter.

Consider moving picnic tables beside the church for outdoor fellowship after services.
